# Mobile Phones

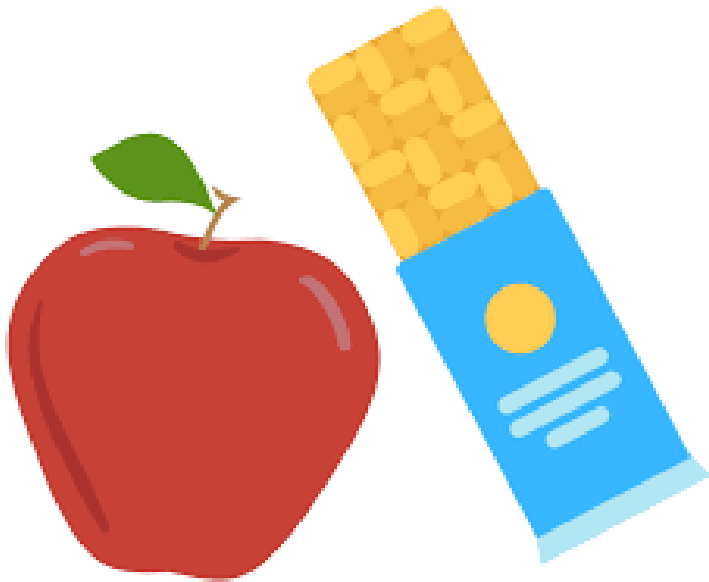


Mobile phones are to be handed in to teachers on arrival to school.

# Attendance Matters




## Attendance Matters!

100% (The Gold Standard)

95% and above (95% = 9 days absent/45 lessons lost in a school year)

85%-94.9% (85% = 29 days absent/145 lessons lost in a year)

84.9% and below (80% = 38 days absent / 190 lessons lost in a school year)
