<u>Language</u>, <u>Literacy & Communication –</u> Focus for this first half term will be on developing confidence with writing words, writing sentences and contributing to sentences, speaking and listening, enjoying and responding to a range of texts about animals and the environment, principally through Drawing Club. The themes for each week will be:

Wk 1 – Disgusting Sandwich – plan and make a recipe for the sandwich.

Wk 2 – Disgusting Sandwich – write a recipe.

Wk 3 – Hamster Care – explore how to care for our class pet.

Wk 4 – Hamster Poster – create a poster for younger children to care for class animals.

Wk 5 and Wk 6 – Pontypool Park – exploring the history of the park and retelling our trip.

Wk 7 – My time in Reception!

Mathematics & Numeracy -

Maths warm ups to include counting to 30 with different starting points, counting back from 20, bridging the tens, making values with number fans, beads, Numicon.

Wk 1 – Number patterns – dice, dominos, regular and irregular patterns. Adding totals using these.

Wk 2 – Counting back to find values.

Wk 3 – Making Number Bonds for numbers to 20.

Wk 4 - Maths Seeds - Explore the app to understand Place Value

Wk 5 - Maths Seeds - Explore the app to understand Adding and Subtraction

Wk 6 – Maths Recap – Adding, subtracting, exploring values in different ways.

Wk 7 – Maths Recap – Counting objects/groups of objects and recording values.

Topic Journey

As well as playing together with the children, experiences we will plan for along with our theme in mind include:

Complete an end of year self-portrait.

Bake and make food for our Picnic in the park.

Join the Hamster Crew – cleaning, feeding and caring for our class hamster, Cow.

Make a disgusting sandwich – would anyone or anything enjoy eating this?

Learn about looking after our local environment – our class, the school, and the wider community like the park.

Explore what all living things need to thrive – including people, animals, plants and flowers.

- Amser snac – Ga I... / Snack time, can I have...

- Ble Mae / Where is?
- Mawr neu fach? / Big or small?
- Ble wyt ti'n byw? / Where do you live?
- Count to ten as part of check in and lining up times.
