What an action-packed Friday we've had this week, celebrating our '2025 School Eisteddfod'! The tremendous efforts put into the competitions, both in school and at home during half term, made this year's Eisteddfod a huge success once again! The classwork competition categories included handwriting, creative writing, art, furthest rugby kick, group singing, and group recitation. For homework, we had categories such as craft,

photography, and the challenge of collectively
