Medium term overview - Summer

Language, Literacy & Communication

Continued opportunities to listen and respond appropriately, and develop confidence through familiar songs and rhymes and traditional tales.

Songs to include: I dig my garden, The little green frog, There's a spider on the floor, There's a worm at the bottom of the garden, There's a little caterpillar on a leaf.... etc

Stories to include: We're Going on a Bear Hunt, The Very Lazy Ladybird, The Hungry Caterpillar, Superworm..... etc.

Mathematics & Numeracy

Opportunities within play, on noticing number, shape and pattern in everyday situations, e.g. in the playdoh, sand and cooking areas.

Explore shapes and repeated patterns found in a variety of plants and foods.

Use various opportunities to develop counting skills in the outside area, including counting the number of legs, wings, eyes etc on minibeasts.

Counting songs which include counting forwards and backwards to include: 1 potato 2 potato, 5 little speckled frogs, 5 ice cream cones in an ice cream shop etc.

Learning through Play Activities

Activities to share and experience seasons and celebrations –

Opportunities for children to engage with:

- Look for signs of Summer on a walk around the school/setting
- Looking for minibeasts and their homes
- Watching caterpillars turning into butterflies
- Practising/taking part in a variety of Sports Day races
- Growing and trying new foods
- Birthday celebrations

Suggested Learning for Home

- Go on a Summer walk and see how many different colours and types of flowers you can see
