

Medium term overview Summer 2 Tulip/Poppy

Language, Literacy & Communication

In LLC this term, we will be exploring the much-loved traditional tales Jack and the Beanstalk and The Three Billy Goats Gruff. Through a structured writing journey, children will experience a range of genres to build their confidence and creativity as writers. Alongside this, we will place a strong emphasis on communication, giving pupils regular opportunities to discuss ideas, retell stories, and develop their speaking and listening skills in meaningful, engaging ways.

Topic Journey

Sewing, threading and weaving: Helps children build fine-motor skills and recognise simple patterns. In class, we'll offer easy materials so they can enjoy creating small designs with their hands.

Clay: Gives children a rich sensory experience and the freedom to shape their ideas. We'll use clay regularly so children can roll, pinch, and sculpt, strengthening their hands and imagination.

Paper Folding: Encourages neatness, symmetry, and following steps. In class, children will fold simple shapes like fans or boats, helping them explore early mathematical ideas in a hands-on way.

Stick and Pea: Building introduces basic engineering and 3D thinking. Children will connect sticks with peas or clay to build small structures, experimenting with balance and shape.

Points and Paper Pricking: Builds precision and prepares children for early writing. We'll use safe tools for children to prick along lines or around shapes, revealing simple patterns through tiny holes.
